

## BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES

**Access to Visitation** 408-325-5294  
Provides court ordered supervised visitation with children and their non-custodial parents. Must be referred directly by Family Court Services.

**Adult Inmate Supportive Services** 408-325-5147  
Assists inmates housed in Santa Clara county, and their families, with a variety of services including book delivery, eye glasses, notary services, resources, and referrals.

**Baby Steps** 408-283-6151 x315  
Provides in-home parent/child attachment and parenting support to pregnant women and infants, particularly those who have been impacted by the criminal justice system. Ask about the **Just Us** program.

**CalWORKs** 408-325-5230 or 408-325-5219  
A multicultural mental health program for CalWORKs participants that helps improve personal and family issues that may keep them from finding economic and emotional self-sufficiency.

**Family & Children's Counseling** 408-283-6151 x315  
Provides therapeutic services for children, ages 6-17, and their families. By utilizing different treatment modalities and working in conjunction with a child psychiatrist as necessary and appropriate, the staff seeks to help children and families address emotional and behavioral concerns.

**Criminal Justice / Parolees Program** 408-240-3380  
Serves adults ages 26-59 with mental health and substance abuse problems, and a criminal background, or those who are at risk of incarceration. Also serves mentally ill parolee-clients and/or those who are referred from the California Department of Correction and Rehabilitation (CDCR). These three Criminal Justice programs are all Full Service Partnerships.

**Behavioral Health Primary Care Clinic** 408-899-7160  
Provides integrated primary care, mental health and substance use treatment services to the adult and older adult populations with mental illness that are being served by our agency.

**KidConnections Network/First 5** 408-283-6151 x315  
Provide developmental screenings, assessments and interventions for children prenatal through 5 years-old. Services may be provided in a child home, school, community or location of caregivers' choice. conducting the screening, assessment, and providing the intervention services may include a Mental Health Therapist and/or a Home depending on the needs of the child.

**Full Service Partnership – Older Adults** 408-899-7141  
Community mental health services for older adults age 60+. Services include case management, medication support, mental health counseling, and crisis intervention to help older adults who have been in institutional settings to move into community locations and services.

**Golden Gateway** 408-899-7141  
Community-based mobile outreach to older adults 60+ years with undiagnosed depression and other mental health problems. Serving the Asian, African-American, Latino, and American Indian populations, as well as the LGBT community.

**Prevention & Early Intervention Support (PEI)** 408-283-6151  
Supports families with community resources for basic needs like food, clothing and housing. Helps children with challenging behaviors at home and school. Provides individualized coaching and therapy for children and families to help them heal from grief and loss, sadness and anxiety groups to improve family communication and strengthen relationships.

**School Linked Services (SLS)** 408-283-6151 x315  
Therapists offer child and family therapy at home or at school for students in the Franklin-McKinley School District.

**Vocational & Educational Re-Entry Services (VERS)** 408-325-5295  
Support participating youth and adults to achieve their individual educational, vocational and/or employment goals. Work with individual participants, their families, probation officers, school officials, volunteer program leaders, training programs, and employers to help participants improve their decision-making skills. Access to Visitation: Provides court ordered visitation supervision.

## CHILDREN, YOUTH & FAMILY DEVELOPMENT

**CORAL After-School Program** 408-283-6150  
CORAL (Communities Organizing Resources to Advance Learning) is a K-8 expanded learning program that focuses on improving academic achievement through literacy and homework support. In addition, CORAL sports and other enrichment activities are provided at each of the 22 sites.

**Family Wellness** 408-675-6571  
Provides parent education workshops for at-risk parents, covering topics such as child development, parent roles/responsibilities, age-appropriate behaviors/expectations, and accessing services. The program provides grade level curriculum information sessions for parents K-3rd grade and includes parent support groups and youth activities.

**Family Resource Centers**  
Promotes school readiness for families with children prenatal through age 5. Six Family Resource Centers serve as community hubs and provide information, resources, support and enrichment programs, and activities for children and their families. Services are available in Santa Clara County's Supervisorial Districts 1, 2 and 4 through Catholic Charities.

**Franklin-McKinley Children's Initiative** 408-675-6563  
A community partnership that supports children from cradle to career through 1) Community Schools; 2) Safe and Strong Neighborhoods; and

3) Economic Development. In addition, FMCI has programmatic oversight focused on alignment and service delivery of family engagement, youth asset building and summer programs, CORAL, and the FIRST 5 Family Resource Center in the Santee neighborhood.

**New Beginnings** 408.380.8600  
Provides opportunities for parents of children 0-3 to enjoy interactive early learning activities with their newborns/infants. Programming includes early literacy, support groups for parents, information on child development, and resource and referral support.

**ProGRIP** 408-429-4764  
Provides program services to youth on gang probation.

**Responsible Landlord Engagement Initiative (RLEI)** 408-283-6150  
RLEI program is a community inspired endeavor focused on encouraging landlords, investors and disengaged homeowners to commit to manage their properties responsibly. RLEI represents a unique and innovative model for engaging negligent property owners, investors and tenants as a way to resolve long standing neighborhood issues.

**Washington United Youth Center** 408-938-6731  
Structured after-school programming and a caring environment for youth and their families: counseling support, recreation, group educational activities, and cultural enrichment programs. Also available are information and referral services for families in crisis and living in poverty.

**Youth Empowerment for Success (YES)** 408-983-6731  
Provides truancy and gang prevention/intervention services to at-risk youth. Works with community partners to conduct ongoing street outreach to youth exhibiting high-risk behaviors, including gang involvement, truancy, and substance abuse. The **FA'ATASI Program** helps at-risk, gang-prone young men to develop cultural sensitivity and spiritual awareness. Includes Probation Gang Resistance Intervention Services for youth on probation.

In partnership with Foothill College, this program offers a 104 hour class and 50 hour practicum that teaches basic, hand-on skills and knowledge for an entry level career as a geriatric home aide. The class is free of charge and is the primary source of recruitment for staff of our Day Break Cares program for Home Care Aides, Activity Assistants, and Transportation Assistants.

### Kinship Resource Center
