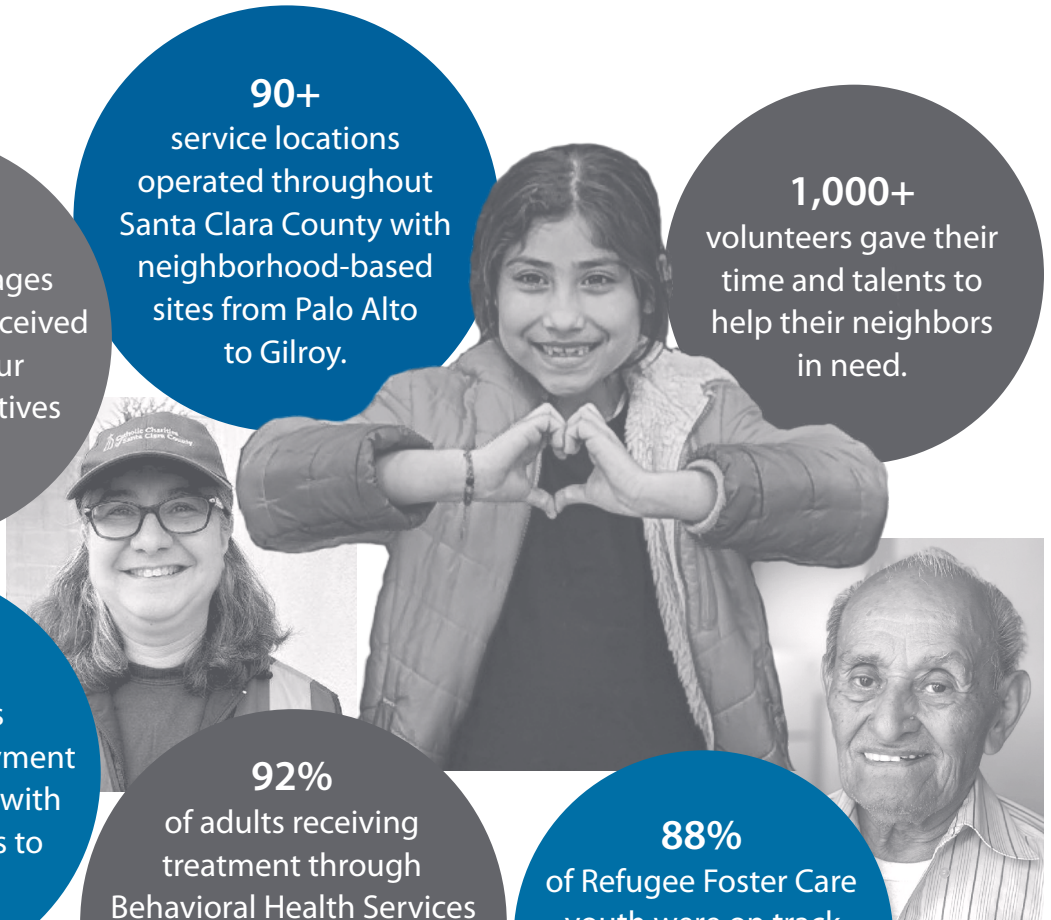

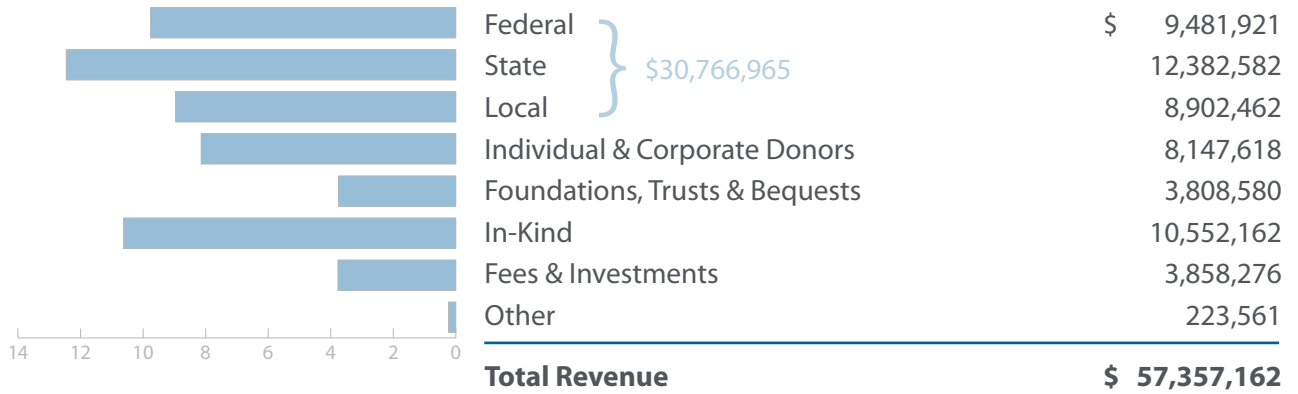

Final planning is well underway for **our new Blossom Valley Family Center**, a state-of-the-art facility offering neighborhood-based services within a new Charities Housing apartment building. In addition, we supported the financial stability of families by expanding our **Family Asset Development** by helping families access public benefits and Earned Income Tax Credits and Child Tax Credits through our **TaxEZ** free tax assistance program. 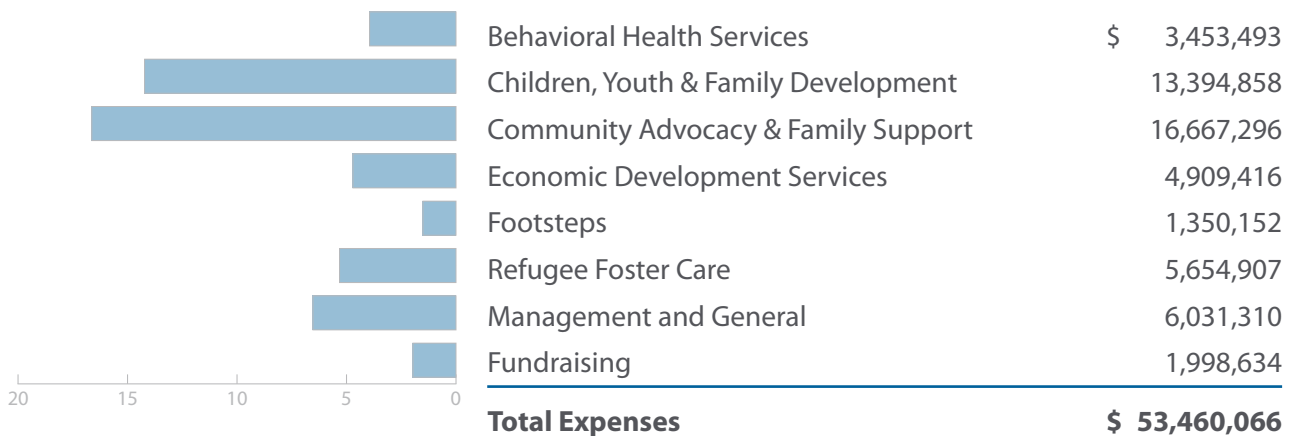
